## **MEMBERSHIP NEWS**

A small but steady flow of new member applications has been received over the last few months. The membership now stands at 184, including 7 corporate members. This is somewhat short of our target of 200 by the end of 2009, but is nonetheless encouraging. 17 new members have joined during the year, and total membership has increased by about 10%. ## **DATA PROTECTION**

The Data Protection Commissioner has advised that the Association, as a charity, is exempt from registering under the Data Protection Law because the personal data which it maintains is used only for the purpose of maintaining contact with members, for accounts and records, for administration and marketing in relation to its activities, and is not passed to third parties. ## **GUERNSEY HEROES OF THE ROYAL SOCIETY**

This programme is now well under way, having been launched with the lecture by Keith Moore, Chief Librarian and Archivist of the Royal Society, on 23 November. Adverse weather conditions meant that he almost did not make it to the Island, but despite a tedious journey he gave a spirited and wide-ranging talk about the 350-year history of the Society, illustrated by many examples of Fellows who had made seminal contributions to world science. The earliest reference to Guernsey which he had been able to find in the archives concerned a 17th century recipe for cormorant, a delicacy which has long disappeared from our tables!

The appreciative audience numbered about 60 - a very encouraging turnout, especially as this event was not only the first in the Guernsey programme, but also the first event in the Society's anniversary year. It is to be hoped that there will be similar support for the exhibition opening at the Priaulx Library in April, the second lecture on 13 May, and the third one on 20 October.

In the meantime, we have been informed that the Guernsey Heroes project is to be featured in the next issue of Inside Science, the Royal Society's magazine. We have also contributed photographs to the Society for its See Further programme, and have been asked to write an article about one of our Guernsey Fellows, Warren De La Rue, for the Friends of Kensal Green Cemetery, where he is buried.

We are required, as a Charity, to claim exemption from Income Tax each year. The revised Constitution agreed at our last AGM has been filed together with our exemption claim for 2010. ## **PROVIDED FOR THE LIBRARY**

During 2009 we saw the successful raising of funds to provide a lift in the Library and it is now in full use. We also funded the provision of a ramp for wheelchairs at the rear entrance and a disabled person's research station. Also we helped with some printing and the provision of wine glasses for use at functions. In addition we have set aside monies for 2010 to assist with new carpeting and with both interior and exterior signage.
