'GUERNSEY ON THE FRONT LINE'

3rd February 2012.

Prestigious evening lecture at the Frossard Lecture Theatre, Candie Gardens by three eminent historians.

An English Professor who is a British naval historian of renown; a Commander in the French Navy who is a specialist in French coastal defence and strategy in the period 1775 to 1914; and an Alderney Jurat who, as a local historian and author, has considerable knowledge of the Channel Islands' historic fortifications.

For the first time in Guernsey, they will address the Anglo-French rivalry over the Channel Islands from 1775 to 1904.

This important lecture, a must for all local historians and those who are fascinated by our place in the struggle between Britain and France, will commence at 7pm and last approximately one and a half hours. There will be a 'Questions and Answers' session at the conclusion of the lectures.

Free admission for Members and £10 for non-Members *by ticket only* available at the Priaulx Library.

Seating capacity in the Theatre is 70 persons.

Membership of the Friends at £10 per annum will be available at the Library. Then the lecture will be free from charge once a Member.

Donations on the evening at the Lecture Theatre will be most welcome.

The Council and the Chief Librarian of the Library will mount a complementary exhibition at the Library (1st Feb to 3rd March) with original books and charts of the lecture period.
